Up-Coming Three Month Liturgy Schedule for November 6, 2021 - January 30, 2022

It's that time once again! The Liturgy Schedule for November 2021 – January, 2022 is in the planning stage. The schedule needs to be printed in advance and made available for the printing of the October 30/ 31 Bulletin and for mailing out before that time!

Consider what is on your personal calendars. There is only one weekday Holy Day of Obligation, a very full Christmas weekend, and the New Years'/Epiphany weekend. This all effects your ability to come to serve the Lord in your respective roles as Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers, Ushers and Greeters.

- There will be a Thanksgiving Day Mass on Thursday, Nov. 25 at 9:00 A.M.

- Advent and the new Liturgical Year begin on the weekend of Nov. 27/28. The new Lector Manuals will be passed out before that weekend.

- The Immaculate Conception of Mary on Wednesday, December 8th, is a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses are at 8:30 A.M. and 6:30 P.M. She is our country's patron.

- Friday, December 24th's Christmas Eve Mass is at 4:00 P.M.

- Saturday, December 25th's Christmas Day Masses are at 8:00 A.M and 10:30 A.M. (No 4 P.M. Mass on Christmas Day.)

- Sunday, December 26th: There are the two regular Sunday Masses: 8 A.M. & 10:30 A.M.
- New Year's falls on Saturday, Jan. 1 so it will have just the regular weekend Masses for the Epiphany at 4 P.M., 8 A.M. and 10:30 A.M. No Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God this year.

THE HUMANITY OF JESUS CHRIST

All three readings today support—each in its own way, of course—a reflection on the humanity of Jesus Christ and how that humanity played a key role in the drama of our salvation. Although not chosen specifically to coordinate with the other two readings, today's second reading does in fact carry forward the theme of Christ's humanity in a remarkable way. The author of the Letter to the Hebrews highlights the solidarity that exists between Jesus and us, precisely because in his human nature Jesus has known the same sufferings and testing that are our own experience. Because he can "sympathize with our weaknesses," we can "approach the throne of grace to receive mercy." For the author of Hebrews, the humanity of Jesus was an essential requirement for his redemptive death, as well as an invitation to us to find in Jesus someone with whom we can identify in our daily struggles.
